



FWRL Roster Freeze – Spring 2012

The FWRL roster freeze date for the core team (before guest players) is close of business on February 24, 2012. Any player added to your team after February 24 is a guest player for FWRL purposes, even though they may be on your subsequent National Championship Series roster or the roster for your league play.

Specifically, Far West Regional League rosters are frozen as follows:

- 1) Please get your rosters into the computer as soon as possible. For ADG states, just get properly registered with your state association as soon as possible – we will take it from there. For non-ADG states, please input the player data on the roster screen in the team information section.
- 2) If your roster is correct in the computer, then that is your frozen FWRL roster and you don't need to do anything else. FWRL will print a hard copy, and any subsequent roster additions for your team are counted as guest players for the remainder of the FWRL season. Any roster changes subsequent to February 24 count against your guest player maximum.
- 3) If your roster is not correct in the computer on February 24, then mail a hard copy to Jim Tilley, FWRL, 4152 Dietz Farm Cir NW, Albuquerque, New Mexico 87107, postmarked by February 24 or e-mail to jim.tilley@regioniv.com. Any subsequent roster additions for your team are counted as guest players for the remainder of the FWRL season. Your roster changes count against your guest player maximum.
- 4) If the player is permanently rostered to your team after February 24, then the player still counts against your guest player maximum. The roster on February 24, is the "team" and any other players are guest players and count against the guest player maximum. If you have used all of your guest players, then add a player to your permanent roster, then that new player is ineligible to compete in subsequent FWRL games.
- 5) Please study the new guest player rule posted on the home page. It is new and simplified effective with the spring season of 2012.
